

A. CYCLONE CUP

The Cyclone Cup is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian States and visiting overseas teams, during the Australian Open Fencing Championships. The winning State or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup. The Cyclone Cup will be presented every year after the Australian Open Fencing Championships.

The Rules for the awarding of the Cyclone Cup are as follows:

1. The Cyclone Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.
2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd enter the Cyclone Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the Cyclone Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of teams of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the Cyclone Cup.
5. There is no minimum requirement for the number of teams entered for a team event to be counted towards the Cyclone Cup.
6. The basis of the calculation for the Cyclone Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
7. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)
 - Team Events – The first two placings for each entity. (Points can be earned from placings in an incomplete series of the tableau)
 - First place – 32 points
 - Second place – 26 points
 - Third place - 20 points
 - 4th place – 16 points
 - 5th to 8th place – 12 points
 - 9th to 16th place – 8 points
 - 17th to 32nd place – 4 points
 - 33rd to 64th place – 2
 - Lower than 64th place – 1

- No entry in event - 0 points

8. The Cyclone Cup will be awarded based on the **maximum** accumulation of points.

B. E. J. V SZAKÀLL CUP

The E. J. v Szakàll Cup is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian States and visiting overseas teams, during the Australian Junior Fencing Championships. The winning State or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup. The E.J. v Szakàll Cup will be presented every year after the Australian Junior Fencing Championships.

The Rules for the awarding of the E. J. v Szakàll Cup are as follows:

1. The E. J. v Szakàll Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.
2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd Enter the E. J. v Szakàll Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the E. J. v Szakàll Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of teams of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the E. J. v Szakàll Cup.
5. There is no minimum requirement for the number of teams entered for a team event to be counted towards the E. J. v Szakàll Cup.
9. The basis of the calculation for the E. J. v Szakàll Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
10. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)
 - Team Events – The first two placings for each entity. (Points can be earned from placings in an incomplete series of the tableau)

11. The E. J. v Szakáll Cup will be awarded based on the **maximum** accumulation of points.

C. JANET HASWELL CUP

The Janet Haswell Cup is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian States and visiting overseas teams, during the Australian Cadet Fencing Championships. The winning State or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup.

The Janet Haswell Cup should be presented every year after the Australian Cadet Fencing Championships.

The Rules for the awarding of the Janet Haswell Cup are as follows:

1. The Janet Haswell Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.
2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd enter the Janet Haswell Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the Janet Haswell Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of teams of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the Janet Haswell Cup.
5. There is no minimum requirement for the number of teams entered for a team event to be counted toward the Janet Haswell Cup.
6. The basis of the calculation for the Janet Haswell Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
7. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)

- Team Events – The first two placings for each entity. (Points can be earned from placings in an incomplete series of the tableau)
 - First place – 32 points
 - Second place – 26 points
 - Third place - 20 points
 - 4th place – 16 points
 - 5th to 8th place – 12 points
 - 9th to 16th place – 8 points
 - 17th to 32nd place – 4 points

8. The Janet Haswell Cup will be awarded based on the **maximum** accumulation of points.

D. CENTENARY SHIELD

The Centenary Shield is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian states and visiting overseas teams, during the Australian Veteran Fencing Championships. The winning state or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup.

The Centenary Cup will be presented every year after the Australian Veteran Fencing Championships.

The Rules for the awarding of the Centenary Cup are as follows:

1. The Centenary Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.
2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd enter the Centenary Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the Centenary Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of teams of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the Centenary Cup.
5. There is no minimum requirement for the number of teams entered for a team event to be counted toward the Centenary Cup.

6. The basis of the calculation for the Centenary Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
7. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)
 - Team Events – The first two placings for each entity. (Points can be earned from placings in an incomplete series of the tableau)
 - First place – 32 points
 - Second place – 26 points
 - Third place - 20 points
 - 4th place – 16 points
 - 5th to 8th place – 12 points

E. FRANK BARTOLILLO CUP

The Frank Bartolillo Cup is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian States and visiting overseas teams, during the Australian U/15 Fencing Championships. The winning State or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup.

The Frank Bartolillo Cup will be presented every year after the Australian U/15 Fencing Championships.

The Rules for the awarding of the Frank Bartolillo Cup are as follows:

1. The Frank Bartolillo Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.

2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd enter the Frank Bartolillo Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the Frank Bartolillo Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of teams of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the Frank Bartolillo Cup.
5. There is no minimum requirement for the number of teams entered for a team event to be counted toward the Frank Bartolillo Cup.
6. The basis of the calculation for the Frank Bartolillo Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
7. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)
 - Team Events – The first two placings for each entity. (Points can be earned from placings in an incomplete series of the tableau)
 - First place – 32 points
 - Second place – 26 points
 - Third place - 20 points
 - 4th place – 16 points
 - 5th to 8th place – 12 points
 - 9th to 16th place – 8 points
 - 17th to 32nd place – 4 points
 - 33rd to 64th place – 2

8. The Frank Bartolillo Cup will be awarded based on the **maximum** accumulation of points.

F. CHARLES STANMORE CUP

The Charles Stanmore Cup is a perpetual trophy awarded for annual competition between the Australian states and visiting overseas teams across the Australian U/23 Fencing Championships in Foil, Epee and Sabre (individual only). The winning State or nation's name will be engraved on a plate fixed for this purpose on the Cup.

The Charles Stanmore Cup will be presented every year after the final event which forms part of the Australian U/23 Fencing Championships has been completed.

The Rules for the awarding of the Charles Stanmore Cup shall be as follows:

1. The Charles Stanmore Cup will be an Oceanic Competition.
2. Affiliated Member States of the Australian Fencing Federation Ltd enter the Charles Stanmore Cup as separate entities.
3. Affiliated National Federations (excluding Australia) of the Oceania Fencing Confederation enter the Charles Stanmore Cup as separate entities.
4. The results of fencers of other nationalities are discounted for the purpose of calculating results of the Charles Stanmore Cup.
5. The basis of the calculation for the Charles Stanmore Cup will be:
 - Entering events
 - First and subsequent places
6. Points are applied to the results of:
 - Individual Events – The first four placings for each entity. (Points cannot be earned from placing in an incomplete series of the tableau.)
 - First place – 32 points
 - Second place – 26 points
 - Third place - 20 points
 - 4th place – 16 points
 - 5th to 8th place – 12 points
 - 9th to 16th place – 8 points

- 17th to 32nd place – 4 points
 - 33rd to 64th place – 2
 - Lower than 64th place – 1
 - No entry in event 0 points
7. The Charles Stanmore Cup will be awarded based on the **maximum** accumulation of points.
